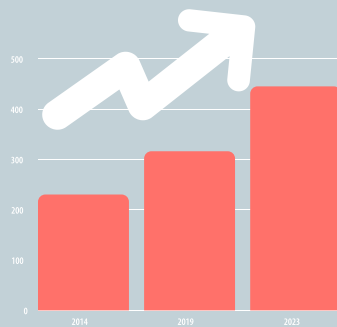
IMPACT REPORT

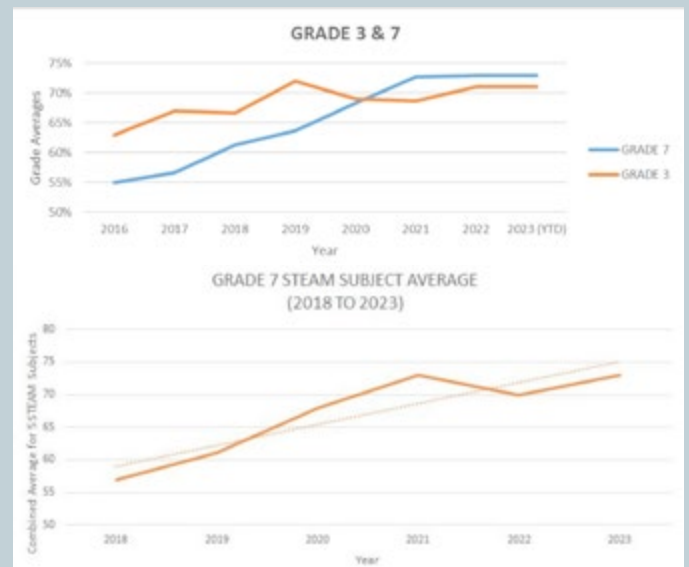

Our integrated approach to teaching of key STEAM subjects encourages pupils to think logically, laterally, critically and creatively. This approach to teaching and learning has successfully and continually improved academic progress since its inception. Data from 2016 - 2023 shows a steady increase in the academic results.

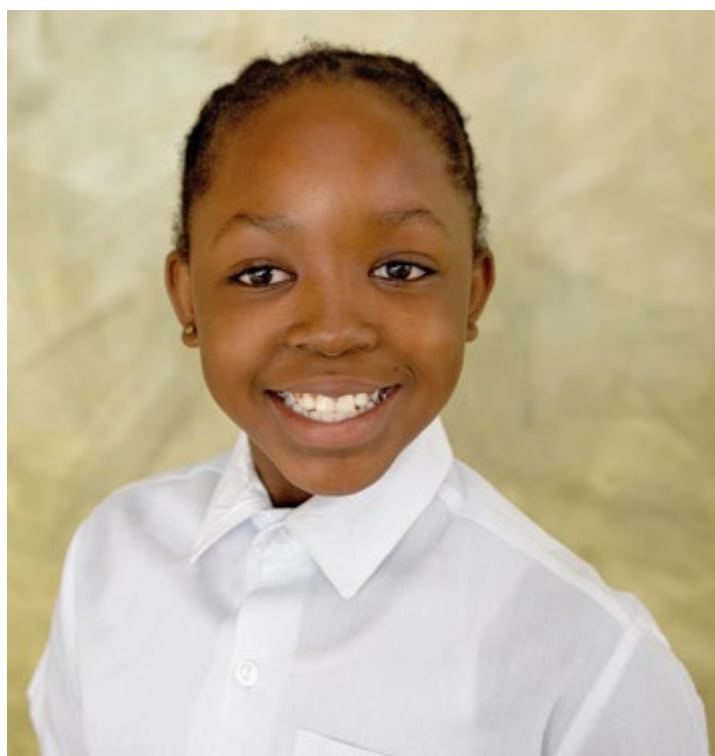
Thembelihle Staff Success
